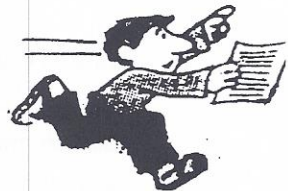

Thank you for your generous gift. I thought you might like to hear my plans for the money.

I'm doing a project at my school that will include buying The required novels for the literature courses that senior 4, 5, and 6 study. Right now, my school, and all the others in my sector, don't have most of the titles in any quantity. As a result some teachers write chapter summaries on the board and the students copy them.

After purchasing the novels, I want to create teaching aids and mock lesson plans for the literature courses, and do a training or two in my sector on good literature teaching methodology.

I also want to fix our library. It's unused and disorganized and boring to be in. I'm going to write a grant for the novels, but transportation costs and lunch provided might mean more teachers will attend the training.

But for sure. I'm going to use the money for paint, low tables, cushions, a mat, and maybe even some games for the library. I really want to be as nice and comfortable place for students to spend their free time. I'll try and spend all the money on the library, but \$500 goes a looong way here in Rwandan Frances.

Thank you so much for praying for me and for helping me. I'll be sure to take pictures and bring them back to show the church. Hopefully, there will be students actually reading books in them!
