One day this month when I came into my office, Hailey, one of the children of our church, and our secretary's daughter (not to mention the Vice-President of Consistory's grand-daughter) was in a particularly good mood. She discovered that the acoustics in the narthex of the church allowed for some echoing! Delighted she stood in the empty lobby and shouted her favorite colors out; "Green and purple!" She did this many times and didn't seem to bother anybody. Sometimes she would change the colors depending on her mood but continued to be in a state of sheer delight! Eventually one of the Agape House kids even started to echo back her calls. This only increased her joy!

In Matthew 19 we find the story of Jesus and some little children: "13Then little children were being brought to him in order that he might lay his hands on them and pray. The disciples spoke sternly to those who brought them; "but Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs." "And he laid his hands on them and went on his way."

Hailey's performance got me to thinking; I'm sure Jesus had many qualities of children in mind when He declared that it is to ones such as them that the kingdom of heaven belongs. But I'd like to think that the ability to lose oneself in sheer joy, to be completely unselfconscious in worship the way that Hailey was in shouting out her favorite colors is part of what He had in mind!

What if we could recapture some of that child-like joy in our worship? I wonder what our worship would look like if it was something we did and completely enjoyed, rather than simply being an obligation to be fulfilled or an unpleasant task to be performed.

In the month of April we had sermons on the following topics;

4/6/14 - Hope in the Midst of Despair (Ezekiel 37:1-14, John 11:1-45)
When we invite Jesus into those desperate situations in our lives there is hope.

4/13/14-Who Is This? (Matthew 12.1-11)

Each on e of us must seriously ask and honestly answer the question of who we believe Jesus to be. Either we believe that Jesus was the Savior promised by God, or He was just a wise teacher with good morals.

4/17/14 - (Maundy Thursday) The Passover Lamb (Matthew 26:14-75)
The symbolism of the Seder meal celebrated by Jewish people (including Jesus and the disciples) applies directly to Jesus who is the Lamb of God who dies so that the children of God do not have to.

4/20/14 - Who Says the Resurrection is Impossible? (Acts 10:34 - 43, John 20:1-18)
We had a special treat as our choir presented an Easter Cantata "Praise The God Of
Resurrection"! Which is more unlikely: that something that once was should be again, or
something that never was should come into being? The resurrection is no more unlikely than life
itself which begins from nothing!

4/27/14 -What Is A Living Hope? (1 Peter 3:1-9, John 20:19 - 31)

The passage from First Peter contains a striking sentence: "By his great mercy he has given us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead" (v. 3b).

What is a "living hope"? According to this passage, it is a hope that is 1) granted in God's mercy, not earned; 2) is a major component of the new birth; and 3) is based on the objective reality of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. This hope is "living" because it is ongoing despite the circumstances, and is a great deal more than a vague and unsubstantiated desire for an afterlife.


