On November 6th our sermon was "Stop Worrying About Being Left Behind!" with scriptures from 2 Thessalonians 2:1-5, 13-17 and Luke 20:27-38. That sermon sought to show that God has chosen us for salvation and has promised us resurrection from the dead and has sent us out to BE good news to all people. Therefore, do not focus on the details of how resurrection works or when the rapture will occur. Instead, reach out to others to share the good news of the Gospel and work towards peace and justice!

On November 13th the title of the sermon was "Get Back to Work!" That sermon was based on 2 Thessalonians 3:6-13 and Luke 21:5-19. It was demonstrated from these scriptures that Christians are called by God to help their neighbors and make the world a better place, not just to stare at the sky and wait for Jesus' return. Because of this we do well to get busy doing the work of God!

On November 20th our scripture reading was from Jeremiah 23:1-6, Colossians 1:11-20 and Luke 23:33-43. The sermon was titled "Making Peace Through the Blood of His Cross." In that sermon we learned that because Jesus died on the cross we are now at peace with God, partners with God and co-inheritors of God's Kingdom with Jesus Christ. As God's partners, then, we work for justice and the righting of wrongs, seeking peace and working for reconciliation.

On November 27th Pastor was away on vacation and Rev. Duane Brown filled the pulpit for the First Sunday in Advent and gave a sermon titled; "Advent Again".
