Members & Friends,

What does the Bible mean in Genesis when it says that God created human beings in God's image as male and female? I used to think, as many do, that God creates some bodies and pours a soul into that body, any soul. Mine just happened to be a male one. A White male one. Living in America. Something that comes with so many advantages I am aware that I pretty much hit the cosmic lottery. But a closer look at the text reveals a few things. First of all, at the time when this part of the Book of Genesis was written, God the Son had not taken on flesh in the person of Jesus Christ. That means that God, as yet, had no physical body and therefore no gender. Yes, God is referred to as "he" and "father" in the Old Testament, but there are also Old Testament passages that refer to God as a nursing mother, a mother hen caring for her chicks, etc. So to be created in the image of God must not have anything to do with our bodies, but must have to do with the fact that we have a soul.

If we bear the image of God at the level of our soul and we were created male and female in the image of God, that must mean that our souls were created with a gender that transcends our physical bodies, our "y" and "x" chromosomes, etc. That means that the way in which we manifest the image of God in which we were created is different for males and females.

God wanted to show the world something of his strength. Is God not a great warrior? Isn't that what Miriam and Aaron sang after the Israelites crossed the Red Sea on dry ground? Has God not performed the daring rescue of God's beloved in coming into the world as Jesus and dying on the cross? And this is why God gave us the sculpture that is man. Men bear the image of God in their dangerous, yet inviting strength. Women, too, bear the image of God, but in a much different way. Is not God a being of great mystery and beauty? Is there not something tender and alluring about the essence of the Divine? And this is why God gave us the sculpture that is woman.

It would be a mistake to look at a sculpture and mistake it for the thing it represents! Our gender is something much greater, much more desired and more foundational to being made in God's image than our bodies and genes. When we deny who and what we are, we deny that part of ourselves and others that bears the image of God.

In the month of August Pastor Scott gave the following sermons:

On August 7<sup>th</sup> our sermon was "Faith – Being Confident When You Have Every Reason to Doubt" with scriptures from Isaiah 1:1, 10-20, Hebrews 11:1-3, 8-16 and Luke 12:32-40. The point of this sermon was that faith is being confident when you have every reason to doubt. We were encouraged to trust Jesus, even when it seems absurd to do so.

On August 14<sup>th</sup> the title of the sermon was "Hold Onto Hope" which was based on Isaiah 5:1-7, Hebrews 11:29 – 12:2 and Luke 12:49-56. In this sermon we learned that even though they didn't receive the promised savior or inherit the promised Kingdom of God, the great heroes of the faith in the Old Testament held onto hope. Like them, we do well to hold onto hope, even when things seem tough.

On August 21<sup>st</sup> our scripture readings were from Jeremiah 1:4-10, Hebrews 12:18-29 and Luke 13:10-17 and the sermon was titled "What's Really Important?" In that sermon we learned that to Jesus people were always more important than policies, even the Torah/law! Based on His example, we may wish to re-evaluate some of our hard-line positions in light of loving grace toward people.





